

Genealogy Charts 1-7

Charts 1-7 on the following pages show genealogical relationships among the Vornkahls listed on pages 5-76. Each chart shows the descendents from an early (usually born before 1750) Vornkahl resident of Nettlingen. In some cases, more than one or two pages are needed to show all descendents of a particular person or couple. In these cases, the chart number is extended with letters A, B, etc. As an example, Andreas Hinrich Vornkahl and Catharine Margarethe Vornkahl require Charts 2A and 2B to include all of their descendents from 1705 to 1900. The data in the charts is identical to the data given in a person's listing on pages 5-76.

Following is a list of the earliest persons (Vornkahl male and spouse) in each of the seven charts:

Chart 1 – Henni Vornkahl (b. about 1627) and Maria Armgard (second of three spouses).

Charts 2A and 2B – Andreas Hinrich Vornkahl (b. 1705) and Catharine Margarethe Vornkahl.

Charts 3A, 3B, 3C, 3D, 3E, 3F, 3G, 3H, and 3I – Henni Vornkahl (b. 1683) and unknown spouse.

Chart 4 – Hans Jacob Vornkahl (b. 1699) and Anne Margarethe Kempen.

Chart 5 – Henni Curdt Vornkahl (b. 1700) and Marie Elisabeth Bodendiek.

Charts 6A and 6B – Johann Heinrich Vornkahl (b. 1753) and Regine Catharine Magdalene Winter.

Charts 7A and 7B – Berend Vornkahl (b. 1679) and unknown spouse.

In some charts, earlier ancestors are known and can be found in the list on pages 5-76.

The children of Vornkahl daughters who married non-Vornkahl men are not, in most cases, included in the charts. Our research is focused on the Vornkahl name. One need only to consider the list of “Spouses of Vornkahl Women” (pp. 80-82) to realize that research on each of those family names would generate an amount of data equal to, or greater than, that which we have for the Vornkahls. Such a task is beyond the ambitions of the present project. Consequently, we have included first generation, non-Vornkahl named children in pages 5-76 but, in most cases, have not entered the names into the charts. Exceptions are Charts 3G-3I which include persons closely related to the ancestors of one of the authors (RAJ).

Some persons listed on pages 5-76 are not included in the Charts, usually because the family connections are not known.

The letter-number combination in bold type found after a person's name in the lists tells in which chart to find the person (*e.g.*, **C3A** = Chart 3A).

Two symbols are used in the charts to help the reader know that no further descendents are known for a person. The symbol † signifies that the person died, often in infancy or childhood, but at least before marriage and reproduction. The symbol ‡ signifies that no further information about the person has been found in the sources we have used.

Friedrich Adolf Vornkahl.

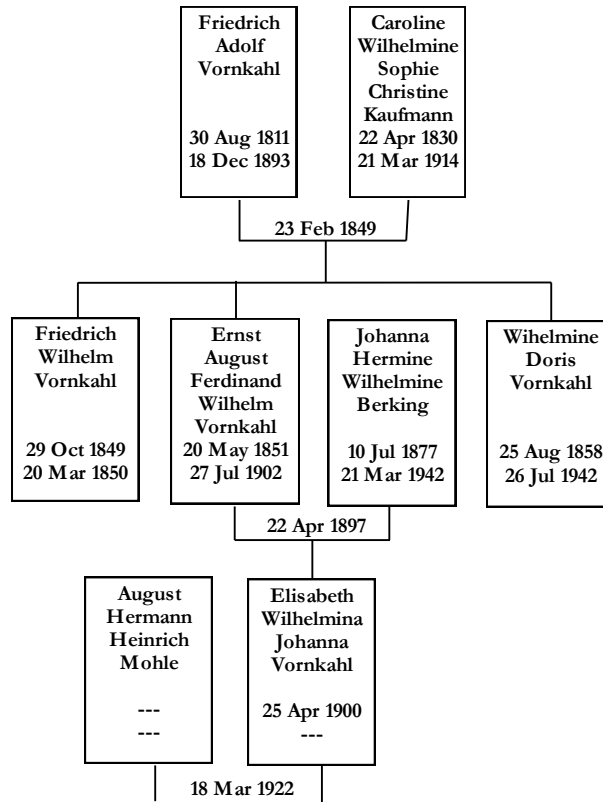
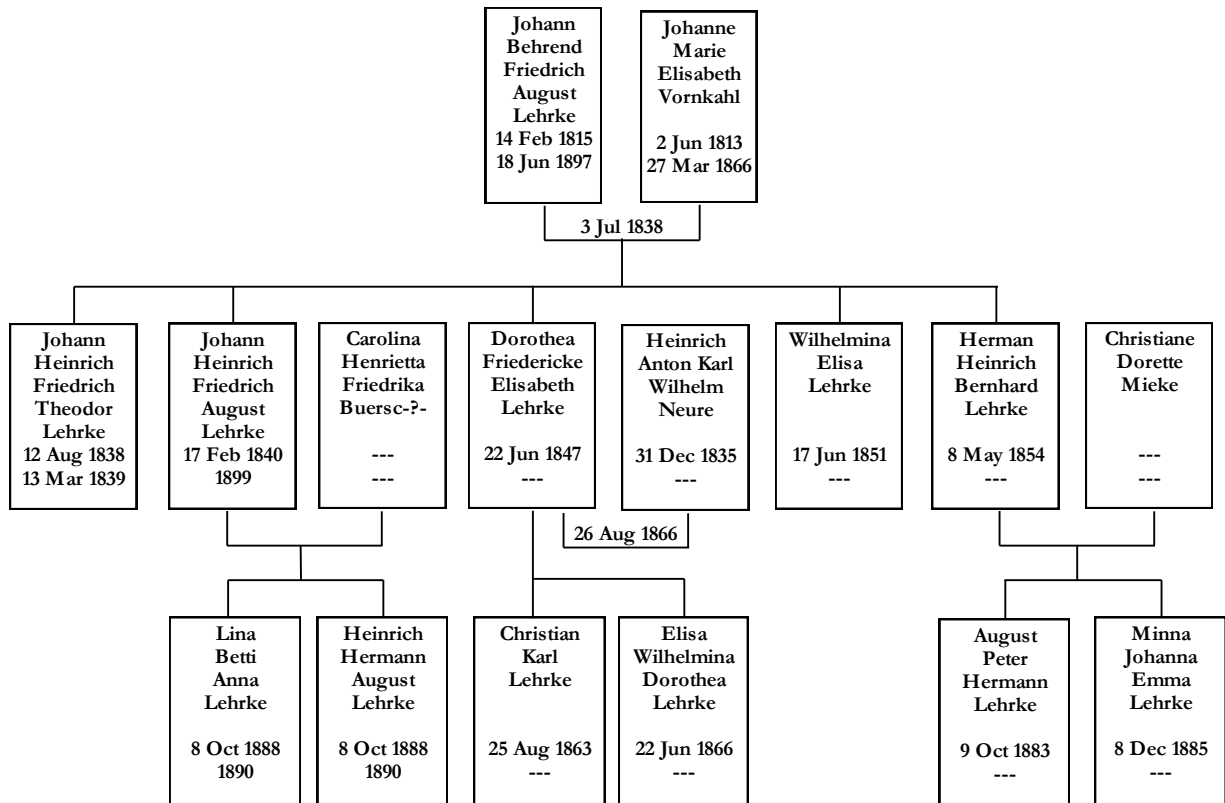
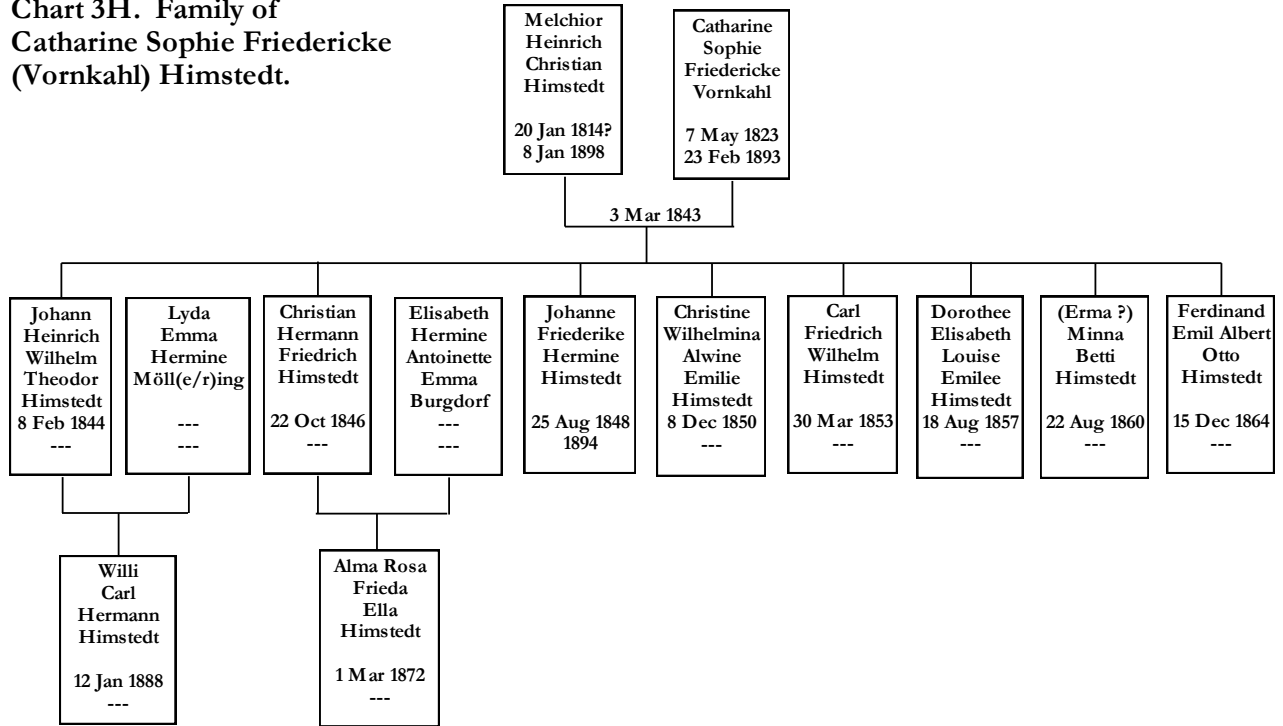


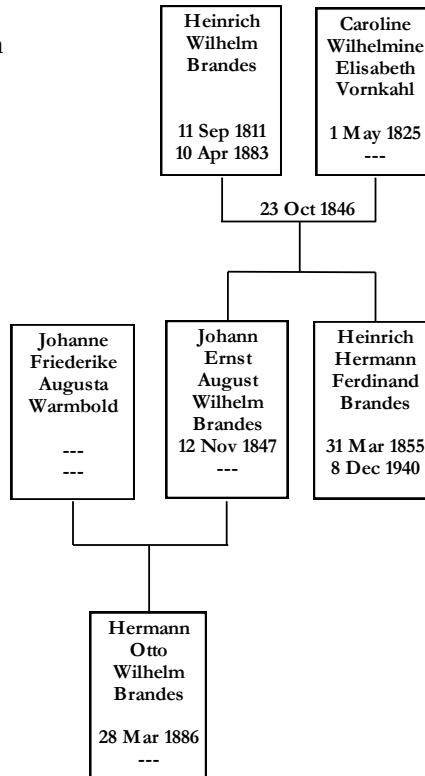
